

Central Legal Staff (law clerks or staff attorneys)

Probation Office

Federal - part of the courts Many States - Part of the Executive Branch

> Pretrial Services Office Similar to the Probation Office

Prosecutor U.S. Attorney (federal) District Attorney (state)

Law Enforcement Agencies FBI, DEA, etc. (federal) Police (state)

Public Defender
Federal - Part of the Judiciary
States - Often established as a separate agency
